All auditors used have completed GSTC auditor training and internal Green Growth 2050 training in the Green Growth 2050 Global Standard certification scheme. Green Growth 2050 Certification is also fully independent from the Certification scheme, the Green Growth 2050 Global Standard.

(11) Qualifications for Third-Party:

1. Must complete the Third-Party training course according to the Green Leaf Sustainability standards.
2. Must audit at least three hotels per year.
3. Third-party must possess the necessary qualifications and ethical conduct. The Green Leaf Foundation will conduct random surveys or inquiries of the audited hotels to evaluate third parties or provide feedback on transparency and all codes of conduct under the Green Leaf Sustainability Standards.
4. The third-party auditors' certification is valid for two years. Annually, auditors must participate in capacity-building on auditing practices; adding new skills in sustainability, current and new trends in tourism, and current and possible environmental impacts from tourism activities, current development of hospitality business on sustainability practices and operations, partnership potential in achieving sustainability in tourism and hospitality business, community demand, role and responsibility in co-creating collaboration programme, and various tourist destinations. to enhance their auditing skills, as required by the Green Leaf Foundation. The regular online and on-site meetings with the auditing team are organised to encourage the sharing of experience in sustainability practices and audit activities.
5. Lessons learned from auditing activities will be exchanged among auditors and the Green Leaf Foundation.

In Europe, accreditation services are delivered through a strategic partnership with Accredia, Italy's National Accreditation Body (Member of European Cooperation for Accreditation). GSTC is working toward expanding its accreditation framework through collaboration with National Accreditation Bodies in Europe to respond to the EU regulation. In this context, accreditation services will be delivered by EA member accreditation bodies to operate in alignment with GSTC requirements. GSTC will remain as a Scheme Owner in the EA member states. Furthermore, the GSTC's accreditation system is developed in alignment with international standards. For example, GSTC accreditation requires full compliance with ISO/IEC 17065.

GSTC is a Stakeholder Member of the Global Accreditation Cooperation Incorporated (formerly, IAF) as scheme owner and an Associate Member of the Inter-American Accreditation Cooperation (IAAC) as accreditation body.

The audit report and certification recommendation are then reviewed by an independent certification committee composed of experts from academia, tourism and industry. Certification decisions are taken according to a six-eyes principle involving the accommodation provider, the external auditor and the independent certification committee.

Eligibility

The Travalyst Certifications Initiative is open to schemes that meet the following requirements:

- Certification schemes promoting environmental and / or social characteristics for accommodations and stays anywhere in the world.
- Wherein a certification scheme means a third-party verification scheme that certifies that a product, process or business complies with certain requirements, that allows for the use of a corresponding sustainability label.*

Compliance Criteria

Eligible certification schemes have declared that they meet the following criteria, which are mandated by the ECGT:

1. The certification scheme is open under transparent, fair, and non-discriminatory terms to all accommodation providers willing and able to comply with the scheme's requirements;
2. The certification scheme's requirements are developed by the scheme owner in consultation with relevant experts and stakeholders;
3. The certification scheme sets out procedures for dealing with non-compliance with the scheme's requirements and provides for the withdrawal or suspension of the use of the sustainability label by the accommodation provider in case of non-compliance with the scheme's requirements; and
4. The monitoring of the accommodation provider's compliance with the scheme's requirements is subject to an objective procedure and is carried out by a third party whose competence and independence from both the scheme owner and the accommodation provider are based on international, European Union or national standards and procedures.
